Add #16 and 17 to read:

- 16. The service provider must provide peer recovery support services and implement full time, part-time, and/or volunteer Certified Peer Support Specialists into their program.
- 17. The service provider must have certified clinical staff supervise the Peer Recovery Specialists regularly.

Except as provided herein, all terms and conditions of the document referenced in the solicitation number above remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

- 8. The service provider will be able to determine the client's appropriateness and eligibility for admission or referral.
- 9. The service provider must be experienced with the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) patient placement criteria for Level I Outpatient and Level II Intensive Outpatient Substance Treatment Services (http://www.asam.org/publications/patient-placement-criteria incorporated herein as if fully rewritten) and be experienced with the DRIVING with CARE Level II Education and Level II Therapy.
- 10. The service provider will be able to determine any coexisting conditions (medical, psychiatric, physical, etc.) that indicate the need for additional professional assessment and/services.
- 11.. The service provider will need to adhere to applicable Territory and Federal laws, regulations, and agency policies governing alcohol and other drug abuse services.
- 12. The service provider will need to demonstrate the proper skills to prepare reports and relevant records, integrating available information to facilitate the continuum of care.
- 13. The service provider will chart pertinent ongoing information pertaining to the client.
- 14. The service provider will need to utilize relevant information from written documents for client care.
- 15. The service provider will need to adhere to Federal Laws including 42 C.F.R. Part it and Health Insurance Portability Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) Privacy and Security Standards pertaining to confidentiality. In addition, enter into a Business Associate Contract with GBHWC to ensure protection of health records.

B. ASAM LEVEL I: OUTPATIENT SERVICES

- 1. Provide services for 12 to 24 adults at any given time.
- 2. Provide relevant alcohol, tobacco, and other drug use/abuse information to clients through formal group processes and education material handouts. Additionally, to engage clients in lively discussions using the given information, to assist them to make rational decisions and build social skills that will prevent substance related problems from re-occurring.
