Services include assistance with activities of daily living, counseling, behavior modification, psychological services, and supportive services for income, public benefits, housing and legal services.

The "Exemplary Service Provider Award" honors an agency, organization or program in the social service realm that exemplifies the best of the NASW Guam Chapter's mission through specific professional accomplishments. In honoring the Exemplary Service Provider of the year, the NASW Guam Chapter highlights superb accomplishments in the practice of the service provider's pursuit.
