

OPIOID OVERDOSE SYMPTOMS



Unconsciousness



Vomiting



Limp arms and legs



Very small pupils



Inability to speak



Pale skin



Slow or shallow breathing



Faint heartbeat



Blue lips and fingernails

HOW TO ADMINISTER NALOXONE

1 Check for **responsiveness and for overdose symptoms**. Shake person and try to wake them up.



Call **911** for help.



Administer **Naloxone** by placing nozzle into nostril and pressing plunger.

4 Perform **first aid & CPR**.



5 Check for **breathing & repeat** steps 3 & 4 if there is no improvement.



6 If breathing resumes, move them to **recovery position** and wait for help to arrive.



* Always have naloxone available and tell someone where it is and how to use it



Opioids are highly addictive and may lead to overdose if misused. Naloxone is an opioid-antagonist used to aid in reversing an opioid overdose.
